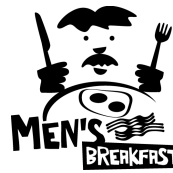

Sewing Bee - August 19 and 20!!

Arlene Gibson will show us how to make a tote bag from 5" squares and table decorations. If you have something to share with the group, bring it and show us how!!



For the tote bag, you will need 35 coordinated 5" squares (JoAnn's sells charm packets that are ALMOST enough!!), 1 yard matching or contrasting fabric for the lining, and 1 1/2 yards of Pellon #987F fusible fleece. The tote bag is 11"x14"x4" and there are two large pockets inside and an envelope-style pocket outside

For the past year we have worked together to memorize, learn, discuss and digest a different Bible verse each week of 52 Great Verses of the Bible. This was just one way for us to take hold of some of the notable passages of Scripture and take them in letting them guide and support us. This effort concludes at the end of August. What a year it has been! We have read. We have memorized. And, we have had the Scriptures permeate our lives. Thank you for joining me in this endeavor.

For the coming year I have worked with our Organist/Director of Music Thatcher Lyman, Izzie Davis and Jeremy Shoop (Organist/Director of Music Ministries at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, Herndon, VA) to identify **52 Great Hymn Stanzas**. Beginning in September we will highlight a different hymn stanza each week. And, we will encourage you to memorize the stanza the same way we memorized the Bible verses of this past year.

Music so often will penetrate into our lives in very special ways of communicating God's care and love, reassuring us in troubling times, conveying thanksgiving and joy, or even expressing our deepest feelings or thoughts. These hymns are born from faith and grounded in the scripture's witness to God's interaction with God's people and all creation.

The stanzas will be varied. Some will be old favorites. Some will be newer or different. But each of them was selected to witness to the faith we are given and help us grow in our appreciation for the diversity and depth of God's love. Each month they will be noted in the Open Door and on our website (www.immanuelwebster.org). They will also be listed in the weekly bulletin.

Thank you for intentionally committing this past year to learning more of the Scriptures, our first language of faith. And join in the effort to continue the growing and deepening of that faith.

Parents are welcome and encouraged to attend.

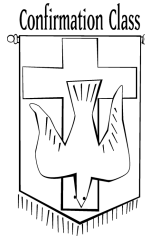
Grades 6-12 will also be doing their annual car wash so wear old clothes because you might get wet!

CONFIRMATION CLASSES Begin in September

Confirmation Classes begin in September for both 7th and 8th grade youth. Classes are on Tuesday evenings, 6:30 ó 8:00 PM. We start with a meal at 6:00 PM. Those youth returning for their second year meet on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of the month beginning September 20th. Pastor Paul teaches this second year class. Youth who are beginning their confirmation experience (normally 7th grade) will meet on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays beginning September 13th. Immanuel's Associate for Congregational Ministry, Dave Ekimoff, teaches this first year class.

What is Confirmation Class? Confirmation Class is a two-year program held twice a month that helps a baptized child of God build upon and learn more about their Christian faith. It teaches the basic and foundational aspects of faith so the young person with the goal that the person affirms the gift of love that God gave in baptism. It is an important time as the young person learns more about the amazing and free love that God gives to the world in Jesus' death and resurrection.

In addition to the Tuesday evening Confirmation Classes youth attend Sunday School (9:30-10:45 AM). Because confirmation is more than classes, youth also attend worship and participate in activities of Immanuel's Lutheran Youth Organization (LYO). Parents have an important role in seeing that the youth attend all aspects of Confirmation Ministry. Their continuing and ongoing support is important and greatly appreciated.

We will hold a meeting for the new students and their families at the end of August or the beginning of September. This meeting will provide an overview of the program and review the expectations of the confirmands and their families. We will also schedule an individual meeting for each family at that time to discuss any concerns or questions about this ministry.

Pastor Paul and Dave are looking forward to another year of growth and study in the Word of God and its meaning for life!

Bell Camp - 2011

Seven ringers (actually six from Webster, then Ginny Wenner flew in from Florida to join us!) loaded up the handbells and all their paraphernalia - tables, foam pads, table cover, mallets, gloves, music, music folders, music stands, and two carts - for travel to Kutztown, PA (near Reading) for a four-day stay at Kutztown University and the chance to take workshops, hear top-notch handbell concerts, and rehearse with 400 other ringers for over 10 hours in an extremely warm Field House on campus, one that had large fans which often had to be turned off because they made so much noise that it was hard to hear the bells ringing!! At least the dorms were air-conditioned!!

The Festival Conference director was a petite woman whose downbeat was hard to see from the back row even when her podium was raised considerably. We worked hard, though, and at the end of the rehearsals gave a credible concert to the public who endured 1 1/2 hours on bleachers in the hot, hot building. Classes and workshops were informative and helpful to the ringers who attended - Toni Baller, Marj Bovenzi, Su Buchholz, Deb Huehn, Nancy Mooney, Marguerite Manning, and Ginny Wenner. We had lots of laughs, ate much food that was walked off on the treks between rehearsal space, workshops, concerts, and the dorm - ALL uphill, I think!! - and interesting music (some pieces were definitely NOT our favorites!). We all took classes from Michael Glasgow, an energetic bell guru who taught six different workshops, among which was one where we learned what else we could do with the bells, including stuffing them and pulling the stuffing out as they rang!! It is always fun to reconnect with other bell ringers that we have met over the years.

In 2013, the Festival Conference will be in Oswego the last weekend in June. Webster Presbyterian Church's director, Jackie Anderson, will be chairperson of our Area II group and will be in charge of it. We hope to be of some service to her as she begins preparations and during the Conference.

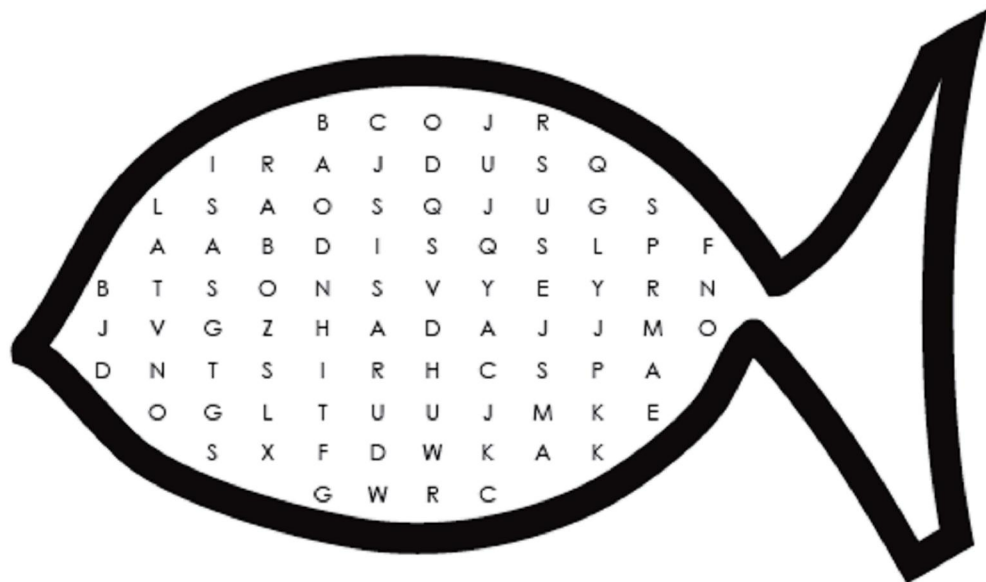

**EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS TAKE
COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND**

Homebound members of Immanuel receive Holy Communion normally on a regular basis. This is possible because of a ministry in the congregation as Eucharistic Ministers continue the communion distribution from our Sunday worship to those members who are in nursing homes, the hospital or homebound. This supplements the visitation and Home Communion that Pastor Shoop shares with our members.

Eucharistic Ministers take communion to 2 or 3 homebound members. This is done following worship on a Sunday. It involves a few hours on these Sundays ó this includes travel time to and from the homebound members' place of residence and the time spent with the member. Eucharistic Ministers also should be regular in their own reception of the sacrament and participation in the ministry of the congregation.
