The funds were sent to Lutheran Ministries of Alabama Inc., Birmingham; Lutheran Services of Georgia Inc., Atlanta; and Lutheran Services in Tennessee Inc., Nashville, he said.

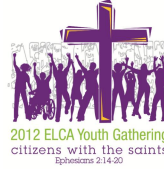

Webster Support Group

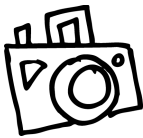

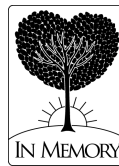
