Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Do you have a health care proxy? The New York Health Care Proxy Law allows you to appoint someone you trust (over the age of 18) to make health care decisions for you if you lose the ability to make decisions yourself. By appointing a health care agent, you can make sure that health care providers follow your wishes. Your agent can also decide how your wishes apply as your medical condition changes. Hospitals, doctors and other health care providers must follow your agent's decisions as if they were your own. You may give the person you select as your health care agent as little or as much authority as you want. You may allow your agent to make all health care decisions or only certain ones. You may also give your agent instructions that he or she has to follow. This form can also be used to document your wishes or instructions with regard to organ and/or tissue donation.

In the church office we have copies available of *Appointing Your Health Care Agent in New York State*. It contains information about the New York Health Care Proxy Law and a sample form. You are welcome to pick up a copy. As you complete a Health Care Proxy, it is important that you discuss your desires with the person you appoint as your health care agent and your alternate. I would also suggest discussing your desires with other family members. You may want to consult with others ó such as a lawyer, your doctor or pastor.

When you have completed your Health Care Proxy, give a copy to your agent, your doctor, your attorney and any other family members or close friends you want. I have a confidential file in the church office where I keep copies that are shared with me. Keep a copy in your wallet or purse or with other important papers, but not in a location where no one can access it, like a safe deposit box. Bring a copy if you are admitted to the hospital, even for minor surgery, or if you undergo outpatient surgery.

I strongly encourage each of you to take the time to complete a Health Care Proxy. It can be an important way for you to provide for your own care consistent with your wishes.

In Stitches/Friday Quilt Group

We have completed another set of 26 quilts for the Veterans Outreach Center in Rochester and they will be delivered there for the residents. Both quilting groups will resume in September. During the summer, watch for garage sales and fabric sales - we can use any kind of cotton fabric and for the backings, old sheets are good. If you have material/sheets to donate, leave them on the top of the coat rack in the lower hallway. And if there are quilt packets made up on the coat rack, feel free to take one home and make a quilt top. The squares are 10 and 1/2" each. The finished quilt top should be 60"x80" - 6 squares across and 8 squares down. Completed quilt tops may be returned to the rack. Please try to complete one top by the end of the summer. If you would like to use your own fabric, that is fine also!!

30 Hour Famine – Haiti Tribal Style

Thank you to Sarah & Kate Nesbitt, Jacob & Mitchell Baller, Allison Barnes, Lauren Bovenzi, Wes òWasò Enterline, GiGi, and Josh Baranello for participating in the 30 Hour Famine. The youth stopped eating at 12 noon on Friday and feasted on wonderful food provided by their parents and others who attended a potluck dinner on Saturday at 6 pm at Church. We raised \$278.50 to send to World Vision. Also thank you to Nan Nesbitt, Marge Bovenzi, and Dave Ekimoff for helping during the weekend.

During our time at Church, we learned about the children of Haiti and the struggles they faced after the earthquake. We played games to emphasize the basic thing we take for granted every day. We drank water, Gatorade, and juice around the clock. Apparently, I snore. That must have been happening in between the time I heard the doors opening and closing during the night. I didn't realize I snored. Maybe it was Josh or Mitchell snoring.

On Saturday, we went to the Open Door Mission. We prepared 60 bag lunches to be handed out to the homeless. The lunches included a bologna sandwich, PBJ sandwich, juice box, chips and cookies. The lunches were given to the homeless men to take with them.

We learned about the Mission from Helen who started as a volunteer in 1986 and now works full time for Open Door. She told us that there are about ten male residents in the S. Plymouth Ave location. The men all come from different walks of life. Some are even professionals. The program can last up to two years. They spend about three hours a day doing Bible study. The men have daily chores to complete. Helen said she has seen a lot of miracles while working at Open Door and told us not to start any bad habits because they are hard to break.

One of the highlights of the weekend was playing sardines. Jacob holds the new record for being hidden for 45 minutes until the last person found him. So, congratulate Jacob on his new record.

I really enjoyed getting to know these youth better. And I also learned a new game. Thanks for this opportunity to serve the youth.

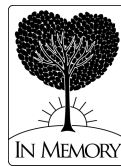
