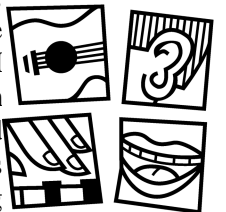

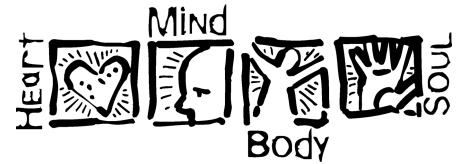
Backpacks Make A Difference

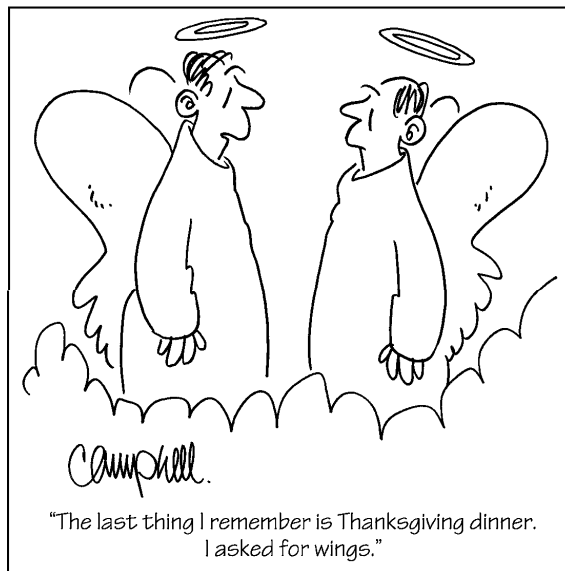

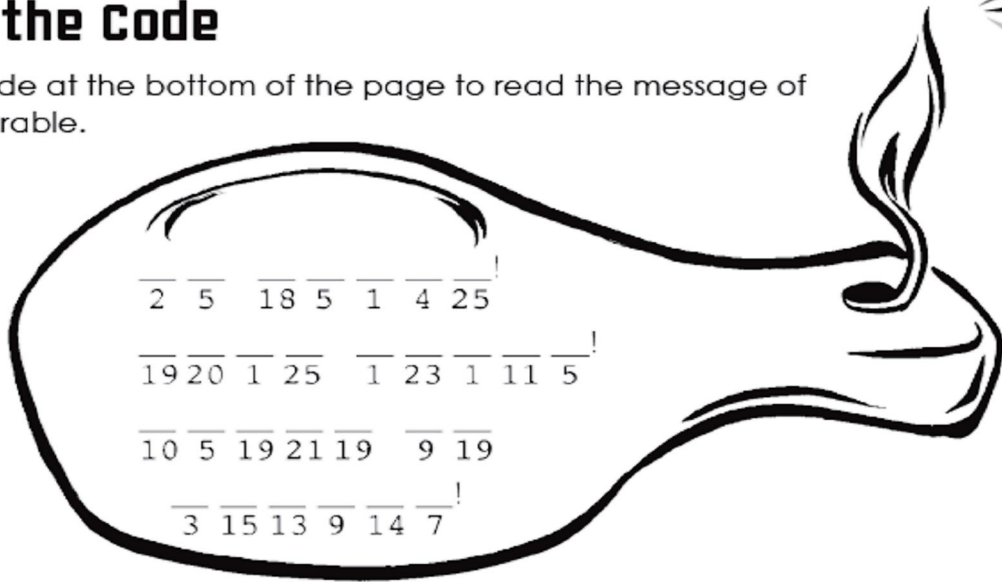
